Literacy

Narrative – Greek Myths

Reading Greek Myths including 'Pandora's Box', 'Theseus and the Minotaur,' 'Perseus' and 'The Wooden Horse of Troy.'

Re-telling a story from a different viewpoint; a character description of a mythological beast; writing a Greek Myth.

Text-based literacy

The Firework Maker's Daughter by Philip Pullman.

Non-Fiction

Oral and written recounts of holidays and Robin Wood Trip. Explanation and Instruction writing.

Poetry

Poetry for Performance; use of personification and metaphor.

Grammar and Punctuation

Word classes (including pronouns and prepositions); accurate use of commas and apostrophes; complex speech punctuation.

Maths

- Place value to 100,000s and 2 decimal places (hundredths)
- Fractions – comparing, ordering, simplifying and finding equivalence
- Written calculation methods for addition, subtraction, multiplication (TU x TU) and division (ThHTU / U)
- Divisibility Rules; Factors and Multiples
- Rounding to nearest 0.1, 1, 10, 100, 1,000 or 10,000

- Time – converting between analogue and digital clocks to nearest minute; time word problems; reading timetables
- Length – converting between mm, cm, m and km.
- Angles – measuring and drawing angles to nearest degree; using angle facts to find missing angles

- Choosing and using accurately mental strategies for addition, subtraction, multiplication and division
